

We are inviting you to apply to be part of an extensive Holocaust education program, including a teacher scholarship to study in Jerusalem.

Successful applicants will partake in the following program:

- One teacher scholarship to attend a Holocaust Studies Program for Australian Educators, at Yad Vashem's International School for Holocaust Studies in Jerusalem, Israel. The scholarship includes travel, accommodation and program cost. The seminar operates from December 31, 2017 and ends on January 17, 2018. All applications must be made before May 20th 2017.
- \$300 for your school to put towards the cost of teacher replacement to enable your History department to attend a two day Sydney Jewish Museum National Curriculum teacher training seminar
- A 50% subsidy towards the program fee of a whole year group of students attending a Sydney Jewish Museum school program

The objective of the Gandel Holocaust Studies Program for Australian Educators is to form an active and organised network of Australian educators committed to teaching about the Holocaust. Successful applicants will take part in a teacher-training seminar at Yad Vashem's International School for Holocaust Studies in Jerusalem. This program will provide educators with practical, methodological teaching tools that convey not only the importance of remembering the past, but how to help shape a better future. Teachers applying to the Gandel Holocaust Studies Program for Australian Educators will be carefully chosen by an Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee offers different scholarships which include tuition, travel and accommodation.

Program Participation - Step Three

The Sydney Jewish Museum will provide \$300 for your school to put towards the cost of teacher replacement to enable your History department to attend a two day Sydney Jewish Museum National Curriculum teacher training seminar. This two-day professional development seminar is designed to address the outcomes of the newly developed Australian National Curriculum. The participants will be provided with teaching materials for classroom use. Teachers will hear testimony from a Holocaust survivor, learn with specialist educators about the challenges and opportunities of teaching the Holocaust in your classroom, as well as be taken on specialised guided tours of the Museum and its archives.

Program Participation - Step Four

Contact the Sydney Jewish Museum to organise a school excursion for a whole year group in 2017. As part of your partnership in this program, the cost of the Museum program will be subsidised by 50%.
