

April 7, 1933

Law for the Restoration of the Professional Civil Service

Excludes Jews and other 'politically unreliable' people from civil service

April 25, 1933

Law Against Overcrowding In Schools and Universities

Number of Jewish students at German schools and universities restricted to 1.5%

October 5, 1938

Reich Ministry of Interior

All Jewish passports must be surrendered, and will only be valid if they contain the letter 'J' stamped in red

August 17, 1938

Executive Order

All Jews with 'non-Jewish' first names were forced to adopt the middle name 'Sara' (for females) or 'Israel' (for males)

September 15, 1935

Nuremberg Law 2: Law for the Protection of German Blood and Honour

Banned marriage or sex between Jews and Aryans
Forbade the employment of Aryan women under 45 in Jewish households

September 15, 1935

Nuremberg Law 1: Reich Citizenship Law

Only Aryans were Reich citizens
ie Jews were stripped of German citizenship, and became stateless

September 29, 1933

Hereditary Farm Law

Jews banned from owning or running farms

March 5, 1934

Jewish actors forbidden from performing on stage or screen

November 12, 1938

Decree on the Elimination of the Jews from Economic Life

Jews banned from operating retail stores and sales agencies, and from carrying on a trade.

October 4, 1933

Editors Law

Non-Aryans banned from working in journalism

1935

Expulsion from the Reich Chamber of Culture

Jews could not hold jobs in radio or theatre, or sell paintings or sculptures

April 7, 1933

Law on the Admission to the Legal Profession

Jews could no longer work as lawyers or judges

December 1938

Jews banned from registering a car or having a driver's licence.

1938

All Jewish shops ordered to close by December 31, 1938

September 1939

Jews must abide by curfews

1933

Jewish doctors barred from treating
Aryan patients

1933

Jews prohibited from producing
Kosher meat

1933

All Jewish civilian workers fired from
the Army

September 1935

Part of Nuremberg Race Laws

German court judges could not cite
legal commentaries or opinions
written by Jewish authors

May 21, 1935

The Army Law

Jewish officers expelled from the
army

1938

Jews could not attend plays or
concerts

September 1935

Part of Nuremberg Race Laws

Jewish university students banned
from sitting for doctoral exams

1938

Jews could not own telephones

December 21, 1938

Law on Midwives

All Jews are banned from the
profession of midwifery

October 15, 1936

**Decree from Reich Ministry of
Education**

Jewish teachers banned from public
school

July 11, 1938

**Decree from Reich Ministry of
Interior**

Jews banned from health spas

April 26, 1938

**Order for the Disclosure of Jewish
Assets**

Jews must report all property in
excess of 5,000 Reichsmarks

October 3, 1938

**Decree on the Confiscation of
Jewish Property**

All Jewish property must be
transferred to non-Jews in Germany

1942

Law against the Purchase of Cake

It is illegal for a Jew to buy a cake.

February 5, 1938

The Law of the Profession of Auctioneer

Jews excluded from the profession of auctioneering

April 9, 1937

Decree from Mayor of Berlin

Public schools must not admit Jewish children until further notice

August 1, 1939

Decree from the President of the German Lottery

It is forbidden to sell lottery tickets to Jews

March 18, 1938

Gun Law

Jews may no longer be gun merchants

November 28, 1938

Decree of the Ministry of Interior

Restriction on the freedom of movement of Jewish people

April 22, 1938

Decree against the Camouflage of Jewish Firms

It is forbidden to change the name of Jewish-owned businesses

February 21, 1939

Decree concerning the Surrender of Precious Metals and Stones in Jewish Ownership

Jews must turn in gold, silver, diamonds and other valuables to the state without any compensation

January 11, 1936

Executive Order on the Reich Tax Law

Jews are forbidden from serving as tax consultants

April 3, 1936

Reich Veterinarians Law

Jews are expelled from the veterinary profession

1937

All Jewish street names replaced. This included 290 streets in Berlin alone

1939

All Jews must relinquish their radios to the police

May 1942

Decree

Jews are forbidden from keeping pets. Existing pets must be surrendered to the authorities – NOT given to anyone else
